FROM THE PASTOR

There is something so powerful, so emotional, about a young woman being pregnant and possibly in danger. The story of Christmas is in part the story of Mary and Jesus being in danger. After Jesus was born, Herod decided Jesus was a threat to his power. Any threat to Herod's power was met with murderous violence.

At first, Mary and her unborn son are in danger because she is an unwed mother. Mary's baby was a sign she broke the law, a crime that could be punished by death. The world thought she had done something wrong and they were ready to punish her. But she was innocent.

Who do we punish? Who are we sure has done wrong? Is it possible that though we are sure of guilt, God knows they are innocent?

Women get pregnant, and men do not. So the sin it takes two people to commit, is blamed on one. Then somehow the child is shamed for the circumstance of their birth, like somehow they had a part in what the parents did. That is how it was with my mother, my brother, and me.

I wish the church had emphasized the unwed mother part of Mary's story. The early church especially cared

for orphans, but it was less generous in how it treated unwed mothers.

On December 5, we will be having a special guest preacher. Nicole Bell is the leader of the LIFT (Living In Freedom Together) program. The LIFT website says, "Our vision is a world where systems of prostitution no longer exist and people no longer feel it is their right to purchase another human's body. LIFT is led by and for survivors (of prostitution), we're building a world where survivors are valued, equal members of the community. Their voice and choices are honored implicitly."

Ms. Bell will talk to us about the needs of at risk women and what her organization does to help get women out of dangerous situations.

The Outreach Committee has planned a congregational meeting for December 12th to vote to give \$10,000 from the Sibley Fund to the LIFT program. The money would go toward a main floor bathroom in one of the two facilities that provides emergency shelter. Please make every effort to attend the special meeting to help ensure we have a quorum.

We have been doing a lot of research about a young program in Worcester dedicated to women who have been living a life of prostitution and are looking for help in turning their lives around. Lots of information about LIFT, Living In Freedom Together, can be found on the internet if you want to learn more. We have met with Nikki, the founder of this program, and are extremely impressed with her and what she has accomplished in a relatively short time. Two of our committee members, Pat Bukoski and Cindy Dube, had the opportunity to visit and get a tour of one of their two facilities in Worcester.

We have received approval from the Church Council and will be moving ahead with proposing to the congregation that we support this program with a grant from the Sibley Fund. We are thrilled to be having Nikki speak to you during the service on December 5th and answer questions you might have. The following week, December 12th, we will be voting on whether or not to award them with a grant. Please mark your calendars and plan to attend on these two dates. The Christmas Fund 2021

For all the sacrifices that clergy and lay church workers have made in our congregations, over 100 years ago the Pension Boards of the United Church of Christ created the Christmas Fund for the Veterans of the Cross and the Emergency Fund, to help support them in retirement and during times of emergent need.

The Christmas Fund provides supplementation of small pension payments for retired clergy who often served small congregations throughout their careers. It provides supplementation of health premium costs, to help ensure their wellness throughout their lives. And the Christmas Fund provides emergency grants in the form of Christmas "Thank You" gift checks for retirees and those facing unforeseen financial hardship.

A gift to the Christmas Fund is your opportunity to join with others in the United Church of Christ to bring good news and great joy to those who have given so much to our church.

In 2020, gifts to the Christmas Fund enabled:

- Monthly pension supplementation for 276 retired clergy and lay employees (\$1,180,187)
- Health benefits supplementation for 89 retired clergy and lay employees (\$274,008)
- Emergency grants for 96 individuals and families (\$214,649)
- Christmas "Thank You" gift checks to 504 retired clergy and lay employees (\$252,000)
