As we get closer to Lent, we will have guides for where to stream the movies and guides on issues the movie raises. We may have movie discussion


Zoom meetings as well.

Here We Grow Preschool

Here We Grow has started enrollment for next year, and our four-year-old classes are filling up. We are not sure that we are going to be able to host a traditional Open House at this time, but we are offering tours in the evenings and on weekends, if you know of a friend, neighbor, or relative who is looking for a preschool.

When thinking about whether to send your child to preschool for the first time, keep in mind what you are hoping to get out of the experience. We start accepting children when they are 2 years nine months and, for them, our focus is all about social/ emotional growth, which means getting along in a group, taking directions from adults other than Mom and

Dad, and learning to share. For children getting ready for Kindergarten, we are focusing more on academic skills such as learning about letters and numbers and printing their names while still providing social skills. We are also fortunate to be able to offer a class for young 4-year-olds. This class is designed for those children who may have already done a year of preschool and need an extra year because they do not make the kindergarten cutoff in their town. We delayed our return to school after the New Year, just in case families attended gatherings over the holidays. Our hope was that any illnesses would be gone by the time we returned to school. So we could still offer the same number of school days, the teachers gave up February break this year. We will be closed on February 15 for Presidents' Day, but will be here the rest of the week.

For those of you who have participated in the past, we will still be doing our annual calendar raffle giveaway, but we pushed it back a month. We will be selling the tickets during the month of March and pulling winners in April this year. We are also still collecting sneakers for our shoe drive fundraiser. BOARD OF DEACONS: Listed in our By-Laws there should be 12 Deacons; however, if <u>one vacancy of 3 year term</u> and/or <u>one for I year term</u> could be filled for meeting decisions/quorum requirement; then, the Deacons would utilize age appropriate acolytes for the church service only.

BOARD OF EDUCATION: one vacancy of 1 year term and one vacancy of 3 year term.
