"Lent is a Gift"

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday which is February 22 this year. On the day before Fat Tuesday (or Mardi Gras if you are French) I will burn the palms from Palm Sunday to make ashes to put on people's foreheads after our Ash Wednesday service.

Wearing ashes has long been a sign of grief, sorrow and/or repentance. We put on ashes to start Lent to hopefully remind us that we are not worthy of God's love and sacrifice on Good Friday. It reminds us that we did not earn the resurrection on Easter. Rather, God did all this while we were still sinners. He did this as a free gift. A gift of great value.

We cannot give a better gift than the one God gave us. We are like little children at Christmas. We get many great gifts from our parents and the best we can give is cute cards and little works of art. No store will take a piece of kindergarten art and give a PS 5 in return.

But parents and grandparents can really appreciate the art made with little hands. I hope that is how God sees our Lenten discipline. It is a gesture, a symbolic action to show we have received a wonderful gift beyond price. Something we could never get on our own.

Our gift will pale in comparison, but we must do something to show appreciation. Something to reciprocate, even if it is only a gesture.

So I hope you find something to do for Lent that will make your life, body, spirit or the world a little better. Or stop doing something you know is wrong.

Also, remember, if it is a fast; i.e., not eating meat on Friday or chocolate ever, Sundays are always a feast day, and we are released from our fast for a day each week.


May God bless you and prepare us all to receive the love and life of Jesus Christ, shown in the events of Good Friday and Easter.

FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

I like to think of February as the month of love!!! Certainly that notion comes from so many years of celebrating Valentine's Day. I suppose it is fitting that our 6-8th grade class is wrapping up our lesson on, "If God is good, why do bad things happen?" If God loves us so much, why is there so much suffering? Teaching this topic is challenging because, like so many other adults for so many generations, I struggle to fully understand the answer. Is it the scholars that study the Bible for years who understand? Or is it the Christian whose faith is so strong, who confidently yields that the will of God is to be accepted, not understood? I do not know the answer to that. Which is exactly what I told our children.

What I do know is that one of the greatest gifts to us, from God, is free will. Humans are free to make our own choices and those choices have consequences. In Revelation 3:20 the Bible says, "Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and eat with him, and he with me." God wants us to hear the knock at the door and choose Him! Sadly, too often, we do not answer the door.

To learn how our own choices bring us to our own consequences, we read Daniel chapter 3, the story of King Nebuchadnezzar and his gold statue. Read it, the story is a great conversation starter. It was a series of choices made by the king, the astrologers (or "tattle tails" as we referred to them in class) and the 3 Jewish men themselves, that lead them into a burning hot furnace. In order to make relatable, the idea of our own bad choices having a ripple effect beginning with those we love most, we discussed topics such as bullying, drinking and driving, addiction and school shootings. All hot topics that our children this age are faced with or will be facing very soon. I pleaded with them to take a moment and consider how the consequences of their actions WILL effect others. We then referred to the 10 commandments and looked at how all of God's rules are about love and peace. Our choices should be made with love. That is God's will. To live in peace and harmony!

Our littlest children learned about Adam and Eve. God created humans to love and take care of His creation. Our job is to watch over and take care of all the animals and all the land and all water. Do our choices portray that responsibility today? Maybe that is something for all of us to reflect upon!

This class is designed for those children who may have already done a year of preschool and need an extra year because they do not make the kindergarten cutoff in their town.
