#### FROM OUR PASTOR:

We are still in the height of the season of Epiphany, and I am working on one myself.

Every year, I choose a word, one word, to be my focus for the year, something to embody the way that I want the year to unfold, an intention. This year for 2025, my word is "relish," and not relish as in the condiment, but relish as in savor or bask, truly dwell in a moment and celebrate it. As I reflected on this word choice, I realize that it is not an easy one to embrace while so motivated to energize, inspire, and continue building a church. Relish means not rushing or forcing. I am not sure that it means being still, not exactly, for truly indulging in a moment is not necessarily stillness, just a full presence. So, my epiphany is the importance of relishing it all, basking in all the goodness at FCC, Auburn for a while, and articulating a vision from there.

So, in the season of Epiphany, we are intended to keep the spirit of that word, an openness to the realization of Christ in our midst....and that isn't difficult to do at FCC, Auburn at all. This past week has been a planning one: relaunching the Saturday Suppers, mapping out the worship services of Lent, and focusing on the mission trip. We can anticipate a little flurry of activity around the Saturday Suppers – I have no doubt we will sell out our first one on MARCH 8th, a meal for community and connection (what a blessing that our scout leader is a professional caterer and can help us make it happen!). What a great partnership to begin, scouts and church working together on these meals that I have been hearing about, with great longing, from people around town.

The donations are impressive for the La Romana mission trip: there are stacks of beautifully colorful dresses made by the Auburn Comfort Blankets team, tools for our building projects, and all kinds of medications and bandages, plus supplies for the kids. I am looking forward to Outreach Sunday on February 16th when we will bless a sampling of the donations before I head off to the Dominican Republic. I also can't wait to share my slideshow with you of my last trip so you can see a snapshot of the sugar cane villages and the ways we are working with people there to ensure basic needs are met: nutrition, medicine, shelter, love.

And Ash Wednesday is on the horizon, always in that wintery, muddy time when we are aching for spring but not quite there. We have a special worship for that night, a time to remember all of our sins and brokenness, detailing the hurts in a time of prayer and music designed to address our darkest feelings as we move through a tough season of forgiveness. I invite you to try my tradition, which involves closing Ash Wednesday with a fire pit outside, and an opportunity to "burn" our sins and watch them engulfed in flames in the darkness, together. This ritualizes our journey of faith through all the loneliness, betrayal, and pain of our lives, knowing that we can't ignore or numb it, with the promise of Easter at the end. Lent will bring evening suppers and education, and a chance to grapple with our faith alone and together. Bring it on!

And so, I ask, will you relish it all with me, the fullness, and linger for a while? We have such divine goodness here, and after the Christmas rush, let's savor all the faith epiphanies around us and enjoy it.




### FROM PASTOR JULIE

### Here We Grow Preschool



I want to start this month by taking a moment to say best of luck to Denise in her future endeavors. We can't thank you enough for all you have done for Here We Grow through the years. From copies, to printing/editing our handbooks and programs, to listening to us complain about life, Denise has been a constant presence that we have all come to rely on. We are going to miss you.

Here We Grow has started enrollment for next year, and our four-year-old classes are filling up. Our **Open House** this year will be **March 20, 2025** from 9-11 AM, and we offer tours during the school day as well as in the evenings and on weekends. If you know of a friend, neighbor, or relative who is looking for a preschool, please send them our way.

When thinking about whether to send your child to preschool for the first time, keep in mind what you are hoping to get out of the experience. We start accepting children when they are 2 years, 9 months. For them, our focus is all about social/emotional growth, which means getting along in a group, taking directions from adults other than Mom and Dad, learning to share and learning skills to become independent. For children getting ready for kindergarten, we are focusing on more academic skills — learning about letters and numbers and printing their names while still providing social skills. We are also fortunate to be able to offer a class for young 4's. This class is designed for those children who may have already done a year of preschool and need an extra year because they do not make the kindergarten cutoff in their town. #### FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

February is Encounter month!!!!! I will be taking a group of 8 young ladies to our annual Monadnock Encounter weekend in Jaffrey, NH. Alongside me, Stephanie Sanborn and Theresa Stone will be joining us as chaperones this year. This camp has been functioning for over 50 years as a Christian camp, created to strengthen the bond between youth and adults while also strengthening the bond we have with God. Just like a really good preschool is able to teach through play, this weekend at Monadnock is set up to worship through play. While we do spend plenty of time in the sanctuary singing and praying and listening to our speaker, when we are not in worship, we are having so much fun!

Here are a few of the fun offerings at Camp Monadnock: snow tubing, gaga ball, ping pong, mini golf, indoor pool, snowshoeing, paint ball, frappes and a snack counter, and plenty of competitive group shenanigans. Our group stays in one big room, loaded with bunk beds so we can have discussions about the day. After each worship session, groups are encouraged to spend some quiet time together, reviewing the scripture and the sermon (and often the music). These are my favorite moments because the students allow themselves to be a little vulnerable and often share their personal experiences.

I love it when my students ask a lot of questions! Truth be told, most of the time I myself do not know the answer they are looking for. My response is often, "You know what? I do not know. Let's look it up together." Or, "That is a great question for Pastor Julie! We can ask her together." I have learned that it is not only okay to not know the answer, but it can be a good tool for growth when a student and teacher find answers together. Being a Christian, and trying to read my Bible regularly, I have questions all the time. In fact, the more I learn, the more questions arise. Questions are a good thing!!!! When a student of any age, asks questions, it shows they are curious and it shows the subject matters to them. This weekend is about learning and growing together.

The speaker for our weekend is Chelsea Erickson. I am very excited to have a woman pastor leading our worship because this year has turned into a "Girls' Trip!" We have only girls in attendance this year. Some are returning students and some are new to the camp. Chelsea has been a youth pastor in the New England area for over 13 years, including the First Congregational Church in Hamilton. This will be the first time in my experience to have a pastor with roots in a Congregational Church. Speaking of "roots," Chelsea is also a writer and editor for "Rooted Ministry," a ministry that specializes in reaching out to teens through conferences, blogs, curriculums and much more!
