Member nominees committing to join or rejoin committees are most welcome and members currently serving terms on committees, THANK YOU! The Nominating Committee will continue to search for support throughout the year as long as there are vacancies open.

Your response to our clothing drive for CityReach in Boston was overwhelming. I was so touched to find the package of 6 new blankets left at the church door overnight on December 5th. We were able to fill the bed of a pick-up truck with warm clothing, blankets, and new white socks, and socks, and socks! As I was sorting and bagging items, because there were so many, I decided to start a bag of socks only. A big black trash bag. By the time I was finished I had filled the bag. I'm sure whoever had to bring that bag out to the truck will attest it was full, and heavy. I wish I had counted them, there must have been 200 pairs or more! Our committee was unable to shop at Salvation Army as planned, but we did purchase 80 pairs of hand warmers that were also delivered to Boston. A special thank you goes out to former Outreach member Shannon Hartmann and her children, Hendrix and Elsa, for delivering the donations to Boston, and to Pastor Brian for his help with loading Shannon's truck.

As I write this, Outreach has one more meeting in December and about \$1,000.00 left in our budget. It was an unusual year in regards to requests for donations. I'm thinking I will suggest we purchase more handwarmers to be distributed to the homeless in the Worcester area and check in with Sally from Auburn Youth and Family Services to see if they have any specific need at the end of the year.

# Capital Fund Drive for HEAT

As you know, the steam boiler which heated the sanctuary and vestry had to be shut down in March due to its deteriorated and unsafe condition. The hot water boiler was also old, and the Trustees decided to replace both with new high efficiency hot water boilers. The congregation voted on September 13th to use invested funds to get this project started as soon as possible.

To date, we have spent \$149,770 on this project. As was voted upon at the special meeting in September, \$87,000 was approved to borrow, interest-free, from our invested funds. Through a capital campaign, we hope to replenish these funds over the next 3 years, 2021-2023, with support from our parishioners.


