"Janus"

A new year has begun. It is January. Named for the two-faced Roman god of doors, archways, beginnings and ends. One face of Janus looks to the future, the other to the past.

That seems a good symbol for January. At this time, we express nostalgia for the past year, or good riddance to a bad year. At the same time, we look forward to the future with a mix of hope and worry.

It is strange that a new year starts in the middle of winter. Just a few days after the shortest day/longest night of the year. It is a horrible time to have a New Year's party. It comes just a week after Christmas, way too close together, in my opinion. It is too cold to have much fun outside. The weather can make travel hard. There is a reason I think rational people should enjoy New Year's Eve in their house watching *The Three Stooges* on what was channel 38.

But January 1st, with all its faults, is the best start of the year the West has ever used. The ancient Romans used January to start the year. The French and English kept time based on the year of their king. This meant each kingdom kept a separate calendar. If we still used this system, what would England do with those months between Queen Elizabeth's death and King Charles' coronation in March?

The Church tried using Easter as the first day of the year, but Easter moves around and no "years" ended up being 365 days, let alone the 365.2422 days it actually takes the earth to orbit the sun.

So when Pope Gregory ordered a new calendar, they went back to January 1 for the start of the year. That calendar, the Gregorian calendar, is the one we still use. By "we," I mean humanity.

The Jews and Muslims have their religious calendars. Saudi Arabia, the home of the two holiest sites in Islam, adopted Pope Gregory's calendar in 2016. Everyday, everyone on earth uses Pope Gregory's calendar.

I pray we all have a blessed New Year. A year filled with laughs. A time of joy with those we love. I pray we will use the days of this year wisely and well, to spread the love of God, and to strengthen our faith.

FROM THE CHURCH SECRETARY

Dear Church Family,

As point of contact for the church's food pantry, I recently approached Pastor Brian and Debbie Pranaitis, cochair of the Outreach Committee, to discuss my concerns about the food pantry. Beginning with the onset of Covid in 2020, there has been a steady decline in visitors to the food pantry. At that time we went from 10-12 families per month to a handful of families. This remained the same until recent months, at which time, due to various circumstances (loss of transportation, health issues and renewed concerns about Covid), we have seen, once again, a drop in visitors to the pantry. Out of a concern that your generous donations to the food pantry would expire before reaching those in need, I brought this matter to Pastor Brian and Debbie's attention.

This led to the Outreach Committee making the difficult decision to close the church's food pantry. Sheila Skog, an Outreach Committee member, contacted the North American Martyr's food pantry, Kateri's Kitchen, and has made arrangements for the existing food pantry donations to be transferred to their food pantry in the new year.

We will continue to collect food pantry donations on Communion Sundays, the first Sunday of the month. All donations will then be delivered to Kateri's Kitchen for distribution to the Auburn community.

Thank you to all of you for both your past and future donations. Rest assured that they will continue to help meet the needs of those who rely on your generosity.
