Dear Church Family, we'd like to share some food for thought about stewardship, courtesy of Pastor Derek French of the East Hills Moravian Church:

"If we're honest with ourselves, we have to admit that many Christians think of stewardship primarily in terms of an annual appeal for financial resources to fund the ministries of their home congregation. But congregations which approach stewardship from a Biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay the bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God."

#### What's spiritual about giving money to the church?

Stewardship is an indispensable part of being a follower of Jesus Christ. It is a faith-based lifestyle which recognizes God's ownership of all things – including our time, abilities and financial resources. As the Psalmist says, "The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it, the world, and those who live in it..." (Psalm 24:1)

Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we trust that worshippers are followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship....Faith is brought to completion through those actions which tangibly express our faith (James 2)."

Our faith inspires us to give, to make a difference in the world, and to secure our church's future for ourselves and our children.
