FROM THE PASTOR

For March, our book and movie club is reading the story of Martha Ballard, her diary from 1785 to 1812.

Martha was a wife and mother and a midwife. She delivered over 600 children in her career. She was originally from Oxford, Mass but during the time of the diary she was living in Hallowell, soon to be called Augusta, Maine.

I have found it to be an immensely fascinating book. Things were very different back then (for example, a young wife needed two pots and a skillet to set up housekeeping). Could you imagine a wedding registry today that only had two pots and one skillet on it?

Of course, the bride-to-be also had to do a lot of sewing and she had to have bed clothes, baby clothes and all the other cloth necessary to set up a house. So the sewing to be a bride could take well over a year. Martha rarely bought cloth. She took the raw fiber, turned it into thread, turned it into cloth on a loom and then turned it into clothing for her and her family.

But even more fascinating, was how things have remained the same. Her main source of happiness was her daughters and sons, as they set up housekeeping and families of their own. Likewise, her main source of anxiety and pain were when her sons and daughters didn't live up to her teaching, ignored her or insulted her.

The American Revolution has almost no place in her diaries. Once again, the most important things in her life were what was happening in her family and how her patients were doing, both mother and child.

I highly recommend the book, especially if you're interested in colonial history or if you're just interested in the lives of women and want to hear a story of how life used to be.


Here We Grow's Open House


"From our Pumpkin Patch" Cookbooks


