#### **FROM THE PASTOR**

"Thankfulness: Can We Make Ourselves Thankful or Must We Already Be Thankful?"

How much control do we have over our feelings? Can we feel thankful just by wishing to or does the world "make" us feel thankful or make us feel cursed? We can have some control over our emotions and we can also get caught in a funk and need help getting over it.

On TV, when they interview a person, they often ask, "How did this (crime/auto accident/fire) make you feel?"

I often reply, "Your brain makes you feel an emotion, not the world." Some people feel relieved when they survive a car accident. Others never drive again. It is too scary. Same event yet different feelings.

When I was having my worst experiences with anxiety, I told myself over and over again that I should not be anxious. But I was. I had some control over the anxiety, but not nearly enough. That lack of control was probably the scariest part of my anxiety. Thankfully, over time, I learned better tools to control my anxiety.

Is that the way with all emotions? Can we learn to control them? Or will they run free and take over no matter what we do? I think we can get ourselves in the right frame of mind and feel better.

We can be thankful. It is good to have Thanksgiving. Even as I am preparing the feast for the family, running around prepping gravy and mashed potatoes and basting the turkey, I can think about how nice it is to have loved ones to share the meal with. There is also a little sadness for those who cannot gather.

I pray you have many things to be thankful for. May God bless you and yours.

#### **Neighbors In Need**

Neighbors in Need is the UCC's annual offering to support ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States. In 2021, the Neighbors in Need "Unfailing Love" offering is focused on supporting organizations and projects that are serving homeless and immigrant neighbors or communities.

One-third of NIN funds support the Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM). Today there are 20 UCC congregations on reservations and one urban, multi-tribal UCC congregation in Minneapolis, MN. These churches and their pastors are supported by CAIM. CAIM is also an invaluable resource for more than 1,000 individuals from dozens of other tribes and nations who are members of other UCC congregations in the U.S.

Two-thirds of this offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries (JWM) to provide funding grants to UCC churches and organizations leading justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects in their communities.

Working with members of the UCC Justice and Peace Action Network, Justice and Witness continues its strong policy advocacy work on issues such as the federal budget, voting rights, immigration, health care, hate crimes, civil liberties, and environmental justice.

#### Outreach Update

Over the last several years we have supported Worcester Fellowship many times in many ways. This is the group who conducts a church service every Sunday behind Worcester's City Hall. At this time, they also serve lunch, provided by local churches, consisting of sandwiches and wrapped snacks and, depending on the season, often soup as well as hot or cold drinks. New white socks are available to attendees as well. Since the pandemic, these services have been moved to the parking lot of All Saints Church, a few blocks up Pleasant St. from Main St.

They also run a drop-in program for the homeless and needy of Worcester at the church known as Thursday Café. This is open for several hours and provides a hot meal, a warm place to sit for a few hours, and even cots and blankets for those who might need a nap. There are always bagged lunches available for participants to take for an evening meal. A few years ago we provided the hot meal which, again, are always supplied by a volunteer group. I think I speak for our entire committee when I say it was a most rewarding experience and we met many gracious individuals. There are several regular volunteers who oversee the distribution of donated items such as clothing, shoes, backpacks, and new socks and underwear.

Our confirmands will be supplying the lunch for the service on Sunday, November 21st. They are asking for donations of heavy weight, men's white socks to bring with them and individually wrapped snacks such as soft breakfast bars and cookies. You can find boxes for these in Fellowship Hall. Outreach will be shopping for the ingredients needed for sandwiches and will also be providing dozens of hard boiled eggs as a take-away item. We will also be sending along a \$200.00 donation for Worcester Fellowship. We will not be bringing clothing at that time but donations are always accepted for distribution on Thursdays and, with winter upon us, men's and women's jackets and warm shoes or boots are in high demand.
