October is the time of year when we will be asked to make our annual pledge to our church. Pledge cards will be mailed to households soon. Pledges made in advance allow the trustees time to prepare a budget for the coming year. There will be a time during the church service on October 18th to put your 2021 pledge card into the Joash Chest or mail it directly to the church at 128 Central Street, Auburn, MA. Thank you. The Worcester Public Library has announced it will be naming its newly renovated children's room the, "Arthur M. and Martha R. Pappas Children's Center."

"Drs. Arthur and Martha Pappas have been leaders in the Worcester community for more than half a century," said Timothy Loew, president of the Worcester Public Library Foundation and member of the foundation's Capital Campaign Committee. "They have always been kind, thoughtful and committed to causes that make our lives better, and their focus on children is so inspiring. We could not be happier or more proud to name the new children's center in their honor."

The "Writing the Next Chapter" campaign has a goal of raising \$4.1 million to support the \$12.7 million renovation project. To date, \$3.9 million has been raised.

On behalf of the Arthur M. and Martha R. Pappas Foundation, Martha R. Pappas will be receiving the 2020 Dr. Richard E. Greene Founders Award in recognition of her inspirational support of the library's children's center renovation. The award is presented annually to an individual or organization that has contributed to furthering the mission of the Worcester Public Library Foundation.

Here We Grow Preschool



While we welcome in the beautiful month of October, the staff, and most of the children, have settled into a nice routine. I am happy to report that almost all of the crying has stopped.

Currently, we have a few openings in the morning and afternoon 3-year-old classes and the 4-year old afternoon class. If you know of someone who is looking for a preschool for their child, please have them call the school at 508-832-8184. The highest compliment we can receive is a referral from family and friends.

Our first fundraiser is currently happening; we are working with Bemis Farm in Spencer to build a scarecrow. This event is open to anyone on Saturdays and Sundays from 9-5 until Oct 20. You must preregister this year at <u>www.bemis.biz</u>. The cost is \$20/ family, (there will be very limited walk-ins for \$30) and you get to: build a life-size scarecrow, walk through the pumpkin path, and receive a small pumpkin and a mum to bring home. During the month of September, the children became familiar with their teachers, new friends, and new surroundings. They had a tour of the entire building and met Denise and Pastor Brian.

Each child received homework the second week of school. Continuing with one of our traditions, the children created a picture page of their families and added it to their classroom family album. It is one of the ways we become familiar with the many different types of families attending Here We Grow. It is also a great way for the children to open up to someone, just by talking about their families.

The children are doing well wearing their masks during the school day. We are very grateful to Michele Fuller's button project, with the help of the Auburn School Department and Jess Hughes Photography, for providing buttons to all of the teachers so that the children can see our faces, even though we are in masks as well. Michele knew that a smile was important for children to see every day.

The Clerk shall issue letters of transfer voted by the Church Council, preserve on file written official reports, give notice of all meetings when necessary, prepare all correspondence not otherwise provided for, and perform other duties as needed to facilitate maintaining the records of the Church."
